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I want to renovate my bathroom but don't know where to start. Any tips?

How messy is a bathroom renovation going to be, and how long until I can use it again?

Bathroom renovations are inherently messy and disruptive - expect dust, debris, and no access to your bathroom for the entire renovation period. The mess extends beyond just the bathroom itself, as dust and debris can spread throughout your home despite protective measures.

During a typical renovation, you'll deal with demolition dust from tile removal, drywall cutting, and fixture removal. Is it worth renovating a bathroom in a house I might sell in a few years?

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My bathroom is really outdated. Should I do a full renovation or just update the fixtures?

The decision between a full renovation and fixture updates depends on your budget, timeline, and how much change you want. If your bathroom layout works well and the major components (plumbing, electrical, tile) are in good condition, updating fixtures can give you a fresh look for much less cost and disruption.

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What colors are popular for bathroom tiles in 2025?

Neutral earth tones and warm whites are dominating bathroom tile trends in 2025, with homeowners moving away from the stark grays that defined the past decade. The most popular colors include warm whites, soft beiges, sage greens, and muted terracotta tones that create spa-like atmospheres.

Warm white and off-white tiles remain the top choice for Ottawa bathrooms, particularly in larger formats like 12"x24" or 24"x48" planks. 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What is the best type of tile for bathroom floors?

Porcelain tile is the best choice for bathroom floors due to its superior water resistance, durability, and slip-resistance options. Unlike ceramic tile, porcelain is virtually waterproof and won't absorb moisture even if the grout fails.

Porcelain tile offers several key advantages for Ottawa bathrooms. It's extremely durable and can handle our freeze-thaw cycles without cracking. The dense composition makes it stain-resistant and easy to clean - important for busy family bathrooms.
